Introduction

Yashchenko Foundation in Numbers

This quarter marked an important turning point for the Yashchenko Foundation. After a quiet start to the year driven by funding delays, we've rapidly scaled up our operations – delivering over 20 tonnes of aid to communities in need, particularly in some of Ukraine's hardest-hit front-line areas.

Our team has worked through ongoing sector-wide challenges, including the USAID stop work order, which caused disruption to several of our partners and impacted their ability to support our logistics. Despite this, we delivered a wide range of support – from medical equipment and mobility aids to school furniture, hygiene kits, and warm clothing – addressing both urgent needs and longer-term recovery across regions like Zaporizhzhia, Kherson, Chernihiv, Mykolaiv, and Nikopol.

A particularly important development this quarter has been the formalisation of our partnership with Direct Relief. This will dramatically increase our ability to deliver life-saving medications to hospitals and clinics, especially in front-line areas. We've laid the groundwork for ongoing medical distribution in Dnipropetrovsk, Chernihivska, Sum'ska, Kharkiv'ska, Zaporizh'ska, and Kherson'ska Oblasts, working directly with local administrations and medical institutions.

We also continued our engagement with international partners, assisting with the visit of a UK Parliamentary delegation to Ukraine in February, marking the third anniversary of the full-scale invasion. The delegation travelled to five cities and witnessed both the scale of destruction and the resilience of the communities we support.

Thank you, as ever, for standing with us. It is your support that makes this work possible.


January was a quieter month for the Yashchenko Foundation, largely due to limited funding and the seasonal slowdown in Ukraine, with many staff taking leave. Despite these constraints, we remained active and delivered two important consignments of aid.

In Kherson, we provided hygiene kits to support families continuing to face hardship due to the ongoing conflict. In Chernihiv, our dedicated volunteer team distributed a mixed delivery of kitchen equipment, a wheelchair, hygiene kits, candies, walkers, and bicycles. This assistance helped both elderly residents and children with mobility needs, while also supporting basic household resilience.

Although the pace of operations was reduced, we distributed 1.9 tonnes of aid in January, maintaining our commitment to front-line communities during a challenging period.



January Deliveries





February marked the beginning of our operational scale-up following the arrival of new funding at the end of January. While preparations for larger distributions began in earnest, our work was affected by delays across the humanitarian sector due to the USAID stop work order, which impacted several of our partners' ability to transport aid on our behalf.


Despite these challenges, we completed deliveries in three oblasts. In Zaporizhzhia, we provided mobility aids and hygiene supplies, including adult diapers, walking frames, bath chairs, sanitary pads, and crutches – supporting elderly residents and individuals living in front-line conditions.

In Chernihiv, our team delivered a broad range of essential items, from tools, chainsaws, and kitchen equipment to clothing, bedding, and toys, supporting vulnerable families through the winter. In Mykolaiv, we delivered temperature-sensitive medication (Adalimumab) to ensure continued treatment for patients with chronic inflammatory conditions.

In parallel, the Foundation supported the organisation of a UK Parliamentary delegation to Ukraine, marking the third anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion. The delegation travelled to Lviv, Kyiv, Kharkiv, Dnipro, and Zaporizhzhia, meeting local leaders and witnessing both the challenges facing communities and the work of the Foundation.



February Deliveries






March saw a marked increase in activity, with over 15 tonnes of aid delivered to communities across Eastern and Southern Ukraine. With logistics fully mobilised, the Foundation focused on frontline regions where needs remain acute, including Zaporizhzhia, Nikopol, and Kherson.

In Zaporizhzhia, two deliveries provided essential hygiene kits and adult diapers, as well as medical equipment including a hospital bed, foldable bed, walker, wheelchair, and a supply of Moxifloxacin Hydrochloride for local clinics. These items supported elderly residents and those living with chronic health conditions in areas with strained medical infrastructure.

A major shipment to Nikopol included clothing and footwear for children and adults, toys, mixed dry goods, hygiene kits, bedding, lighting supplies, and pet food. This broad-ranging consignment was aimed at supporting whole households through winter recovery and ongoing displacement.

In Kherson, the Foundation made three separate deliveries of cleaning materials, hygiene items, school furniture, household appliances, and furniture. These included couches, ovens, fridges, desks, washing machines, and dryers – alongside essentials like clothing, bedding, and sleeping bags – helping families re-establish basic living conditions.

Partnership Update

March marked a major milestone for the Yashchenko Foundation as we finalised our partnership on-boarding with Direct Relief – one of the world's largest and most respected providers of humanitarian medical aid. This new relationship represents a significant expansion of our capacity to deliver life-saving medication and medical supplies to hospitals and communities across Ukraine.

Through this partnership, the Foundation will begin receiving large volumes of high-quality medication on a regular basis, enabling us to respond more effectively to urgent medical needs in front-line and under-served areas. The partnership also strengthens our logistics model, allowing us to plan and deliver more consistent support to the healthcare system in a time of continuing strain.

As part of this expansion, we have developed working relationships with medical institutions and regional administrations across Dnipropetrovsk, Chernihivska, Sumska, Kharkivska, Zaporizhska, and Khersonska Oblasts. These partnerships will form the backbone of our future medical distribution work, ensuring that supplies reach hospitals, clinics, and patients quickly and securely.

This new collaboration with Direct Relief marks a step-change in the scale and quality of our medical aid programming and reinforces our long-term commitment to supporting Ukraine's healthcare infrastructure throughout the war and beyond.
